

JODI CLARK | BIO

Originally from Western Australia, Jodi Clark has studied at Santa Monica College in California, USA and completed her Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting and Drawing) at UNSW Art and Design, Sydney, where she currently lives and works.

Her work is based within the narrative of feminism, aiming to challenge stereotypes, subvert assumptions, point out hypocrisies, and reclaim the overt consumption of women's bodies and sexualities. Clark deconstructs and reconstructs existing images, experimenting with how their meanings become re-authored in new contexts. Through the exploration of line, the composite images evolve, becoming distorted and decontextualized, rendering new forms that resist categorization or traditional standards.

Her images are not cute, comfortable or easily digestible. The viewer doesn't immediately own the experience; they must take time to figure out what they're looking at, and then confront their own judgement through a slower and more reflexive process than they are used to. Clark's style of drawing protects the image from a purely consumptive gaze and disrupts the viewer's ease of interpretation.

Clark focuses on disrupting the passive compliance of conventional societal ideologies in regard to identity, and the normative performances that regulate that discourse. By presenting hybridised portraits that interrupt the 'either/or' binaries of gender and sexuality, the possibility of "the other" comes to the fore. Clark's grotesque, large-scale drawings alter the body itself in a way that renders it uncategorisable to an audience so accustomed to the homogeneous, easily readable human form.

Her drawings rely on abstraction, hybridity and decontextualisation to make a hyper-significant visual break from human identity as constructed through sex, gender and sexuality. Her subjects encapsulate performative notions of gender and in many previous pieces her drawings have been juxtaposed upon decorative, ornate "wallpaper" backgrounds which point out the performative aspect of the conventional interior space. In this series, instead of representing wallpaper in her work, Clark presents her work through wallpaper, blurring the lines between the aesthetic and functional, "art" and "craft", the decorative and the narrative.






'You Must Be This Tall To Ride', 2014 Charcoal on Board




Detail of 'Carousel Horse', one panel from You Must Be This Tall to Ride All 8 panels were transformed to create 8 unique wallpapers.




Jodi Clark 'Carousel Horse' You Must Be This Tall To Ride, 2014 Price indicator \$2,500 per 10 meters squared.




Jodi Clark 'Peros Calientes' You Must Be This Tall To Ride, 2014 Price indicator \$2,500 per 10 meters squared.




Jodi Clark 'Lady Boy' *You Must Be This Tall To Ride*, 2014 Price indicator \$2,500 per 10 meters squared.




Jodi Clark 'The Peahen' You Must Be This Tall To Ride, 2014 Price indicator \$2,500 per 10 meters squared.




Jodi Clark 'The Ring Leader' You Must Be This Tall To Ride, 2014 Price indicator \$2,500 per 10 meters squared.
